Biographical/Sketch/Administrative History

Peter John Baldwin Lash was born in Toronto, Ontario, on October 24th, 1910. The eldest son of lawyer John Francis Lash and grandson of Zebulun A. Lash, Peter Lash attended Upper Canada College in Toronto and Trinity College School in Port Hope before attaining a BA from the University of Toronto in 1933. He began his legal education the same year at Osgoode Hall Law School, and was called to the Bar in 1936. He then joined his father at the Toronto firm of Blake, Lash, Anglin and Cassels, and in 1942, he and his father formed the firm of Lash and Lash, which later became Lash, Lash and Pringle. During the Second World War, Lash served with the Foreign Exchange Control Board in Ottawa. In addition to his work as a lawyer, Lash served as a director for a number of companies, including Canada and Dominion Sugar Company Limited, Larcán Investments Limited, International Business Machines Company Limited, Western Assurance Company, Toronto Iron Works, and others. Lash died in Havana, Cuba, on April 14th, 1959.

Scope and Content

The collection consists of records accumulated by lawyer Peter Lash. The origins and purpose of the collection is not known, but the records in the collection are a variety of business and property agreements from Ireland, originating from the city of Dublin and County Tipperary. The name William Curry, of Dublin, appears prominently in two of the three documents in the collection. Documents include deeds of co-partnership and rental indentures.

985144-001 Deed of co-partnership. -- 25 Mar. 1805. -- 1 p. ; 54.5 x 74.5

Scope and Content

Item is a deed that established a co-partnership, to be called "Dolier, Curry and Company", between three Irish merchants: Isaac Dolier, William Curry, and David Courtney. The document was signed in the city of Dublin and details the terms and conditions of the co-partnership and the roles of each partner, who were timber merchants. Agreement was witnessed by Kearney and Barry.

Restrictions

No restrictions on access.

985144-002 Lease of house on Stephen St., Dublin. -- 10 Apr. 1807. -- 1 p. : vellum ; 50 x 52.5 cm

Scope and Content

Item is a rental agreement between owner William Curry and renter Charles Shaw for a house on Stephen Street in the city of Dublin. The document establishes the terms and conditions of the lease, including the annual rent.

Restrictions

No restrictions on access.

985144-003 Conveyance. -- 9 July 1808. -- 2 p. : vellum ; 69 x 75.5 cm

Scope and Content

Item is a conveyance between Richard Sparrow of Oakland and John Flanigan of Clonmel, in the County of Tipperary, Ireland. The document details the terms and conditions of a renewal of an 1781 indenture relating to a rental property.
