D'Alton McCarthy, Jr. fonds. -- 1853-1872. -- 6 p.

Biographical/Sketch/Administrative History

D'Alton McCarthy was born in Oakley Park, Ireland, on October 10th, 1836, to D'Alton McCarthy and Charlesina Hope Manners. He came to Canada with his parents in 1847 and was educated in Barrie, Canada West. In 1867, he married Emma Catherine Lally, who died in 1870. In 1873, he married Agnes Elizabeth Lally, the sister of his first wife.

D'Alton McCarthy, Jr. was admitted as a student-at-law by the Law Society of Upper Canada in 1853. He articulated with D'Arcy Boulton of Boulton and McCarthy, his father's firm, and in 1859 was called to the Bar. McCarthy and his father established their own firm in 1869. D'Alton McCarthy, Jr. was elected a bencher of the Law Society of Upper Canada in 1871, made a Queen's Counsel in 1872, and in 1873 was named solicitor for Simcoe County. He moved to Toronto in 1876, but maintained professional and personal associations in Barrie. The following year he founded the law office of McCarthy, Hoskin, Plumb and Creelman.

D'Alton McCarthy, Jr. was elected a Member of Parliament for the constituencies of Cardwell (1876-1878) and Simcoe North (1878-1898), serving in the Conservative caucus (1876-1891) and then sitting as an independent until his death on May 11th, 1898.
