## **Alexander Logie fonds. -- 1843-1872. -- 1 cm of textual records**

### **Biographical/Sketch/Administrative History**

Alexander Logie was born in Rosefield, Nairnshire, Scotland in 1823. It is not known when he moved to Canada. In 1843, he was admitted as a student-at-law by the Law Society of Upper Canada, and was called to the Bar in 1848. He practiced in Hamilton, Ontario, and later served as a judge with the Wentworth County Court (1854-1873). Logie was active with the St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in Hamilton, acting as a teacher, elder and trustee. He served on Hamilton City Council from 1857 to 1860. Logie died in Hamilton on December 10th, 1873.

### **Scope and Content**

Fonds primarily consists of certificates relating to the legal career of Alexander Logie. The remaining items are of a personal nature, including newspaper clippings regarding his uncle, William Logie, and an invitation.

### **Restrictions**

No restrictions on access.

### **Title Notes**

Title taken from content of the fonds.

985183-007 Invitation to Major and Mrs. Logie from Governor and Lady Barnes. -- [between 1890 and 1910]. -- 1 p.

*Scope and Content*

Item is an invitation sent to Major and Mrs. Logie to attend a dinner hosted by Governor and Lady Barnes. Major Logie was William Alexander Logie, the son of Alexander Logie.

985183-008 Uncle William's death. -- 1864-1872. -- 8 p.

*Scope and Content*

File consists of undated newspaper clippings referring primarily to William Logie. The clippings consist of two articles advocating that William Logie be hired as the Town Clerk of Glasgow and three obituaries for Logie after he died suddenly while serving in the Court House, Glasgow. The last clipping is an obituary for Alexander Barclay, Receiver General.
