**Biographical/Sketch/Administrative History**

William Mulock was born on January 19th, 1844 in Bond Head, Ontario, to Thomas Holman Mulock and Mary Cawthra. Mulock earned a Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of Toronto in 1863, was admitted as a student-at-law by the Law Society of Upper Canada that same year, and called to the Bar in 1868. Mulock practiced in Toronto and was appointed a Queen's Counsel in 1890. Mulock served as Chief Justice of the High Court (Exchequer) of the Supreme Court of Ontario (1905-1913), Chief Justice of the High Court of Justice of the Supreme Court of Ontario (1913-1923), and Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Ontario (1923-1936). He was an ex-officio bencher of the Law Society of Upper Canada from 1936 to 1944.

Mulock served as a Member of Parliament for the riding of York North from 1882 to 1905, and served as Postmaster General and Minister of Labour under Prime Minister Laurier. He was Vice-Chancellor (1881-1910) and later Chancellor (1924-1944) of the University of Toronto and president of Farmer's Loan and Savings. Mulock died in Toronto on October 1st, 1944.

**Scope and Content**

Fonds consists of bound volumes relating to the legal career and personal life of Sir William Mulock. Volumes relate to a Canadian Bar Association trip to England and to dinners held in honour of Mulock as Chief Justice of Ontario.
