

# TAG – The Action Group on Access to Justice

TAG is a community of organizations and individuals committed to working collaboratively to find new solutions to access to justice challenges in Ontario.

## Why do we need TAG?

People's legal needs are changing and the justice system is inaccessible to far too many. We must find better, more affordable and timely ways for people to manage and resolve their legal problems.

No single organization has the answers. Collaboration, innovation and broad participation — not only from the justice sector — but from related organizations and the public, is required.

## How does TAG work?

Through TAG, organizations and people with common goals connect, share ideas, pool expertise and resources and work collaboratively to build lasting solutions to access to justice issues.

TAG was launched in June 2014. Its first priorities are building a framework for its collaborative work and establishing 'clusters' of members who share a focus on a particular access to justice challenge. Initial clusters include a group working on streamlining online family law information and a group focused on building an electronic communication platform for the TAG community. Additional clusters are in development.

## Who is TAG?

TAG is a community of organizations and individuals. Members include representatives from the government, courts, lawyer and paralegal associations, clinics, legal service providers, academia and community agencies.

As the catalyst organization for TAG, the Law Society of Upper Canada, with support from the Law Foundation of Ontario, provides administrative resources to facilitate progress toward the goals set by the TAG community.
